## Zoning Reminder:

**SECTION 3.15. KEEPING OF PETS.** No more than three (3) adult dogs and/or cats in combination shall be kept or housed in one (1) dwelling unit in any residential zone.

**SECTION 2.15 C. v. Barking Dogs:** No person owning or having charge, care, custody, or control of a dog or dogs shall permit such dog or dogs to continually, frequently, or habitually bark, yelp, or howl in such a manner as to be plainly audible at a distance of more than 100 feet from the property line of the property from which the noise originates between the hours of 7 a.m. and 10 p.m. or at any distance from the property line of the property from which the noise originates between the hours of 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.
